Installation
To install using SketchUp, go to Window > Extension Warehouse in the menu bar. Once Extensions Store has started, type 'Architectures for SketchUp' into the search bar. Click the extension thumbnail and select Install extension on the listing page to complete the installation. To manually install, download the latest version of the extension through Extension Warehouse. After downloading the file, run the Extension Manager by selecting Window > Extension Manager from the menu bar. Click Install Extension and select the downloaded file from the File Browser window. Import textures
Click the Architectures icon or select Extensions > Architectures for SketchUp from the menubar to launch the extension. After launch, the texture library is displayed with filters to quickly reduce your selection. Click any texture in the library to open a preview and access the Import or Edit options. Click Import to add the material to your material palette. Once the material is imported, the paint bucket tool automatically starts with the new material selected. Create custom textures
Any texture in the library can be adjusted to fit your design. To edit a library texture, just click it and select Edit in the preview window. This starts the editor with the preset parameters depending on the selected texture. You can then adjust the configuration and import as needed. Alternatively, you can select New Texture from the main view to start the editor with the default settings and create your texture from there. Edit imported textures
edit an existing Architectures material, right-click on any face where that material is applied and select Edit with Architectures from the context menu. This starts this texture in the editor allowing additional adjustments. Once you have adjusted the texture as needed, click Update to existing material. Adding Extensions to SketchUp
The Extension Warehouse and SketchUp were made to work together. In most cases, to add an extension to your local copy of SketchUp, simply click the Install button on the extension’s details page and wait a moment while the software does the rest of the work. However, this magical installation process comes with some caveats: You must access the Extension Warehouse from SketchUp (unlike a browser). If you access the Extension Warehouse from a web browser, you will see a Download button instead of the Install button, and you will need to install the .rbz file downloaded manually via SketchUp Preferences.Tip: Installing and managing extensions is easier if you access Extension Warehouse from SketchUp by selecting Extensions > Extension Warehouse. The extension is free. Many extensions in Extension Store are free for you to download and use. Developers also have the option to sell extensions for a one-time fee or a subscription. When an extension is available for purchase, where you usually see the Install button, you see a Buy button and sometimes a Test Install button, as shown in the figure below. A trial extension is free to use for a limited time. In some cases, an extension is available for purchase, but you need to purchase the extension from the developer’s website and install the extension manually. Note: If you are not familiar with the features of the extension details page, take a look at the introduction to the Extension Warehouse interface in Getting Started. If you’re wondering how to uninstall, update, or otherwise manage your extensions, see Manage Extensions. The following sections explain what you need to know about installing extensions manually, purchasing and the use of an extension after its installation. Manual installation of extensions in SketchUp
If you download an extension from the Warehouse extension through a web browser or from from developer’s website, its extension is packaged as a .rbz file that you can install manually. Here are the steps to follow:
In SketchUp, select Extensions > Extensions Manager. The Extension Manager window appears. Click the Install extension button. In the Open dialog box that appears, go to the .rbz file saved on your computer, select the file and click OK (Microsoft Windows) or Open (Mac OS X). When SketchUp advises you to only install extensions from trusted sources, click Yes to proceed and install your extension. (This assumes that you, in fact, trust the source of your extension.) Try or Buy Extensions in Extension Warehouse
Whether you’re logged in to Extension Warehouse via your browser or SketchUp, you can buy an extension. However, to install a trial or purchased extension, you must log into the Extension Warehouse via SketchUp. The following steps will guide you through making a purchase:
On the extension details page, click the Purchase button. (If you can download a trial version before you buy, you will view a trial installation version from the SketchUp link. To install a trial, see the steps below to install a trial or purchase.) When prompted, enter your billing and payment information. Billing information is required to verify your credit card. Your receipt is sent by email to the email address you use to log into Extension Warehouse. If you don’t receive a receipt email shortly after completing your purchase, check your spam folder. Tip: After purchasing an extension, Extension Warehouse does not offer refunds. If you want to test an extension before you buy it, look for an Install Test button, which allows you to test how the extension works before you buy it. If you have problems purchase an extension or want to contact us about an Extension Warehouse purchase you have made, fill out our customer service contact form and, from the drop-down list you would like, select Resolve a Problem. To install a trial or purchased extension, follow these steps:
In SketchUp, select Extension > Extension Warehouse and log in to Extension Warehouse. To install a test, locate the extension you want to test, and on the extension details page, click Install Test. If you have already purchased an extension, go to Step 3. In the user menu, select My Extensions. On the My Extensions tab, scroll down to the trial extension or purchased extension you want to install and click the Install Trial or Install link. In the figure below, you will see an Install Test link. When SketchUp asks you if you trust the author and want to continue installing the extension, you must click Yes to proceed. After a few moments, a dialog box confirms that the extension has been installed. Finding and using an extension after it installs
After installing an extension, how is it used in SketchUp? Sometimes, an extension appears in an Extensions menu, as shown in the figure below. Simply select an extension from the menu to start using it. The extension can also add a toolbar to use the features of the extension, such as the Curve Maker toolbar shown in the figure. Other times, an extension is in the Drawing menu, the Tools menu, or a context menu. Tip: For details on how to use an extension, read the extension’s documentation, which you can find on or through the extension’s details page. For example, the extension details page might include a video, instructions, or links to more documentation on how the extension works. If you have any questions, take a look at other users’ comments (also on the extension’s details page) or check if the developer provides contact information via the extension’s page.
